Online Presence, and received a cheque for £100. Have a look at: www.aub-unison.org.uk




BRANCH AGM 2016 DATES ANNOUNCED

This video linkup by the TUC General Secretary Frances O’Grady, with special guest presenter Eddie Izzard, was broadcast live simultaneously to branch meetings all over the country.

We had set up meeting rooms at both RGU and the University of Aberdeen for members

to attend and watch, and heard how the measures in the Governments “Trade Union Bill” are being fought by unions, and how many aspects of the bill are being questioned in the House of Lords, and even by Conservative MPs!

With draconian regulations on industrial action ballots, removing the law prohibiting agency staff being used to break strikes and direct attacks on the funding of unions amongst others the bill

Your Name

Owen Cox, UNISON Steward

How long have you been active in UNISON?

I have been with the University of Aberdeen for over ten years, but it is only in the past couple of years that I actually joined a trade union, which in turn led me to be successfully nominated as a UNISON steward.

What made you want to become a UNISON representative?

First and foremost, I observed the good work that Trish Burnett and Chris Mcleod had undertaken to get the security deputy supervisors allowances revisited and adjusted. They got an allowance every year for being a deputy supervisor, but this had never risen with inflation or wage rises. UNISON sorted that out for us.

There were other issues that I felt passionately about and with the University negotiating with unions through the collective bargaining agreements, I thought that joining the union, was a no-brainer, to be part of a voice that is listened to.

What help did you get?

The branch were very supportive and I got paid time off to attend the UNISON stewards training which helped me understand what I needed to do in discussions with members and when representing them.

What do you enjoy about being a UNISON representative?

I have always enjoyed healthy debate and do believe in being part of the solution, rather than the problem. I believe in honesty, integrity and transparency and hope to demonstrate these values in my



performance as a steward. I attended UNISON's National Delegate Conference this year and was very proud to be able to represent the branch as a delegate.

UNIVERSITY FINANCIAL PRESSURES

Both universities have been in talks with campus trade unions over recent months with regard to financial pressures they are experiencing.

The University of Aberdeen, having continued to try to make very significant cuts recently reached agreement not to go into any immediate compulsory redundancies until the ongoing funding picture is clearer, and even then agreed to put in place a focused Voluntary Severance scheme first.

The Robert Gordon University

also met with trade unions over significant concerns regarding a shortfall in student numbers which is having a major impact on finances. Although no specific measures other than to look at ways to increase revenue had been put forward at the time of going to press, the University could not rule out any measures including the potential for redundancies in

the longer term.

We'll continue to represent members' interests at these negotiations and will provide updates on the situation whenever we have further information or more details.
